Trinity Hospital Twin City's imaging services department recently upgraded its services with the purchase of stateof-the-art, digital mammography and bone density

machines and the addition of a new team of radiology specialists. The equipment purchases were made possible in part thanks to the Trinity Hospital Twin City Foundation.

In the fall of 2011 and early 2012, the Trinity Hospital Twin City Foundation (a separate 501 (c) 3 entity) brought in more than \$87,000 through a community giving campaign that yielded donations from many community residents and small businesses. The funding assisted the hospital in purchasing the new mammography machine, which will prove critical in the fight against breast cancer.

Mammography is still considered one of the best forms of protection against breast cancer because the machine can often detect breast cancer in the early stages when it is most likely to be treatable. The American Cancer Society recommends that women age 40 and older have a yearly mammogram.

with New Equipment and Radiologists A new digital bone density machine was also purchased to conduct screens for osteoporosis, a disease of the bones that weakens the bone structure and makes them more prone to breaking. It is recommended that people 65 and older have a bone density

age 65 who have risk factors for osteoporosis. Much of Trinity Hospital Twin City's major equipment had been updated in 2009 when the facility's 41,000 square foot medical center first opened. However, the mammography and bone density machines were the last major equipment modules that still needed replaced in the imaging department. With digital technology, images are clearer; the transmission of images to physicians and specialists is easier; and patients benefit from a lower average dose of radiation and faster screening times.

Dena Putnam, RT(R)(M), director of the hospital's imaging services department, noted, "The digital mammography machine can detect cancers more easily, especially for women with dense breast tissue. We're completely state-of-the-art now, and most of our imaging equipment is under four years old."

Trinity Hospital Twin City also recently added a new team of radiologists from Aris Radiology to read and interpret images. Every Aris radiologist is board certified and experienced in multiple forms of imaging modalities. The group provides coverage of the hospital's imaging department 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and the hospital is able to work with radiologists with different specialties in order to ensure the timely, accurate interpretations necessary to deliver high quality patient care. 🕰

The hospital held the second annual "In the Pink" health fair designed to combat breast cancer through education, awareness and survivor recognition. The free event was sponsored by the Trinity Hospital Twin City United Volunteer Auxiliary and the hospital's Community Outreach Department. On Thursday, October 25th, about 70 people received breast health education and delicious food. Special speakers, breast cancer survivor recognition, and a walk by candlelight for breast cancer awareness also took place at "In the Pink."

'We were happy with the turnout at our 'In the Pink' evening," shared Tiffany Poland, Director of Community Outreach. "We were also honored to recognize sixteen breast cancer survivors."

Each survivor received a gift presented by breast cancer survivor Gracie Murphy and hospital volunteer Jan Thomas, who were speakers at the event. Trinity Medical Group gynecologist, Dr. Walter Randolph, also spoke at the event and provided information about self-exams.

Lori Dallacheisa, an occupational therapist, certified lymphedema therapist and certified mastectomy fitter from Medi-Wise Pharmacy at Newcomerstown, offered great advice about what types of lotions and supportive clothing are available to make life during and after breast cancer treatment more comfortable.

Representatives from the Trinity Hospital Twin City Foundation presented a "check" for over \$87,000 to hospital President Joe Mitchell to help the hospital fund its new mammography machine, and event guests received a tour of the Mammography suite at the hospital's imaging department.

The walk by candlelight, which began with a prayer led by Pastor Jill Barlock of Dennison, concluded the "In the Pink" event as the 70 participants engaged in a walk in front of Trinity Hospital Twin City to honor those who are battling breast cancer and to remember those who have battled breast cancer.

Living Our Mission

On Friday, August 24th, the celebration of Trinity Hospital Twin City's 100th anniversary commenced with the blessing of the new Chapel. The Most Rev. Frederick J. Campbell, Bishop of the Diocese of Columbus, blessed the Chapel during a special ceremony. More than thirty people gathered in and around the Chapel to participate in the proceedings.

Trinity Hospital Twin City's previous Chapel was quite small, so in the months before the blessing ceremony, the hospital's mission integration team worked to identify and renovate a space within the hospital for the new, larger Chapel. Upon approval from the Bishop, the new space is named the St. Clare Chapel, and the Chapel is conveniently located near the hospital's inpatient rooms on the first floor.

At the ceremony, the space officially became a Catholic Chapel, and it is furnished with all the proper liturgical furnishings. The Bishop also gave permission for the presence of the Eucharist. The chapel features a

special prayer bowl where visitors can write their prayer concerns on special paper, put the paper in the bowl and watch the paper fade away as a symbol of prayers being lifted to God.

Trinity Hospital Twin City Director of Mission Integration, Sister Dorothy Jayne Krupp, shared, "How fitting is it that we had the Blessing of the St. Clare Chapel to begin our 100th anniversary celebration in this year when the Church celebrates the 800th anniversary of her leaving home (she left home in March 1212) and giving herself to God through the radical way of life of poverty."





Thanks to financial donations from many of you, the Trinity Hospital Twin City Foundation (a 501(c)3 organization) was able to help the hospital purchase a new mammography machine in August 2012. Now the hospital needs help to purchase a complete Gastro-Intestinal (GI) Endoscopy System which is critical in the early detection and treatment of colon/colorectal cancer. Please consider making a tax-deductible donation to the Foundation's 2012 Annual Giving Campaign to help purchase this equipment. The goal is to raise at least \$100,000 of the \$400,000 purchase price, and your donation in any amount, would be greatly appreciated. The equipment will be used in more than 350 surgical procedures each year including appendectomies, hysterectomies, laparoscopic gall bladder removals and endoscopies. The new system will be used most often for colonoscopies, a screening test for cancer that has the potential to reduce colorectal cancer deaths by 60%. Your help can ensure that this important cancer screening will be offered at Trinity Hospital Twin City for years to come. Thank you for your consideration and support.

Surgical Team Revue Earns Glowing Review

Performing surgery is a serious business requiring the utmost in caring and surgical skills. Still, the experienced surgical team at Trinity Hospital Twin City knows it takes more than medical skills to provide high quality care for patients. It takes a willingness to care for the whole patient to make him or her feel at ease from the moment surgical preparations begin until the patient leaves the recovery room, ready to begin the journey to full health.

That special kind of caring meant the world to Cherie L. Fischer-Immel, 45, of Dover, Ohio. The busy mother of three and grandmother of one and Office Manager of Swiss Village Insurance recently underwent a second mastectomy as a preventative measure to keep her metastatic adeno carcinoma (liver, lung and bone cancer) from coming back. She was understandably nervous when she arrived for surgery. "I was so scared," she shared. "The surgical nurses sang to me before the surgery. It was awesome. They just gave me peace and were so comforting. In recovery, they sang to me again, and they all hugged me." Fischer-Immel also praised her surgeon, Dr. Matthew W. Phillips, MD, FACS. She appreciated the care and concern he had for her. "He's more than awesome," she noted. "I tell everybody he's an angel."

Fischer-Immel was pleased with her entire surgical experience at Trinity Hospital Twin City. She's used other hospitals in the region, but felt they didn't give her the level of care she received at Trinity Hospital Twin City. "It was better than good care," the five year cancer survivor said. "It was the best experience for what I had done. Now, I will go nowhere but Trinity Hospital Twin City."
